Polar regions have witnessed rapid changes in the past decades, and in the future these changes in the environment and the socio-cultural and economic structures will become much broader, intensive and complex. The Graduate School focuses on increasingly recognised processes of global change in polar regions and it aims, in particular, to discuss global environmental change and its impacts on tourism, and the role of tourism in global environmental change in polar contexts. However, the Intensive Course aims to focus not only on tourism but also on wider changes in physical and socio-cultural environment and their relationship with localised socio-cultural, economic and ecological processes changing polar regions presently and in the future.

Who Should Attend

Doctoral students (also outside of the organising doctoral graduate schools), and other associate students are invited to participate in the course.

Registration

Deadline for registration and abstracts (250-500 words in English) is 23 November. The abstracts will be used for the Abstract book which will be distributed to all the participants. Participants will get a certificate on their participation, specifying the content and extent of the course.
